When one door closes, another one opens ...

This phrase is meant to express positivity in the face of challenging circumstances. Some people have no problem dealing with adversity. For others, the mere thought of stepping through another passageway is paralyzing. It is in those times that the wisdom and compassion of others is needed to guide them towards the potential and promise that can be theirs. For over 70 years, JFCS has represented the door to opportunity and growth, so that our clients do not have to face their problems alone. Once we give them the keys to realize a better tomorrow, they are able to create their own future, each and every day thereafter.

As the senior population in South Jersey grows, JFCS continues to provide unparalleled services to thousands, so that our clients may age in place with independence and dignity. In particular, we have extended the breadth and footprint of services to Holocaust Survivors, so that they may receive the comfort and critical care they need. This year, we proudly provided over one million dollars of support to area Survivors. In addition, our Take the Wheel program is expanding, so that we may service more veterans in need of transportation to their medical appointments. This innovative volunteer program lifts up those who have bravely stood for our country.

Our counseling department remains at the forefront of mental health client advocacy and action, further developing key programming for those in need of care. To address common issues pertaining to transition in young adults, the counseling department launched two groups: "This Is Me" for pre-teen girls, and "This is My Life" for young adults needing guidance after their high school and college years. Each program enables our clients to take steps toward growth and higher self-esteem – giving them a plan, offering coping strategies, and developing goals, so that they can effectively face challenges. Our Right in Our Backyard Program has expanded to bring awareness to the general public on the epidemic of addiction, and to assist those families in our area who are currently struggling.

The Rhona Fischer (z"I) Family Assistance Program has been a mainstay for those who are amongst the most vulnerable in our community. Our Betsy and Peter Fischer Food Pantries saw a 25% increase in demand for food this year, providing nearly 7,000 individuals with sustenance from our three pantry locations. The Project SARAH Domestic Abuse Program continues to host clients in our safe house, "Charlotte's Place," and conduct outreach and education to hundreds of area youth on healthy relationships. This year, Project SARAH hosted an eye-opening documentary film screening of "The Hunting Ground" for 188 attendees to raise awareness of the prevalence of college sexual assault.

The Special Needs Department has had a banner year. Our Soups and Sweets Culinary Training Program offered expanded catering menus to the public, and raised over \$65,000, which went right back into fortifying the program. Since its inception, this initiative reports an impressive 79% employment placement rate among its participants. Our Supported Employment Program has empowered I 30 individuals through job mentorship and coaching to prepare them for the workforce. In fact, four of our clients who were placed in employment recently celebrated I 0 years at the same job!






